

Building an Environment for Cross-Disciplinary Leadership

The *Forging the Future* campaign transformed Norwich facilities and beautified the campus. It strengthened the physical foundation for the University's mission to create an intellectual landscape where cross-disciplinary thinking flourishes, making and doing thrives, and students reach their potential inside and outside the classroom.

- **\$58 million+** raised for academic priorities including the new Mack Hall and renovations to Dewey, North and Ainsworth Halls.
- **Three new Academic Centers for Excellence** embrace Norwich's dedication to enhancing and advancing a culture of interdisciplinary research and collaboration.
 - **Center for Cybersecurity & Forensics Education and Research (CyFER)** is a formally established entity for the development of emerging, advanced and next generation computing technologies.
 - **Center for Global Resilience & Security** builds resilient communities through research and design collaboration.
 - **Peace and War Center** advances knowledge on the relationship between peace and warfare at local, national and global levels.



Thank You for Honoring the Past and Investing in the Future

Inspiring the Next Generation of Thinkers and Doers

Constructed in celebration of Norwich's 200th birthday, the Bicentennial Stairs connect the southeast corner of the Upper Parade Ground and the Sullivan Museum and History Center. The stairs memorialize 78 individuals who made significant contributions to the development and legacy of the University in its second century.

Over 600 alumni, parents, friends, students, and faculty and staff purchased granite bricks that line the walkways of the UP. Through their generosity, renovations to the Upper Parade Ground were completed to enhance and preserve the walkways for the third century of service.

Making Norwich More Affordable for All

- **\$21 million** to the Norwich Fund allow the university to use endowment income to support financial aid.
- **Nearly \$58 million** awarded in financial aid in the 2019-2020 academic year.
